Wil and Kristi Boren met at a local favorite, the Downtown Eatery & Spirits, a business that Kristi co-owns. "I may have left my credit card at the Downtown as a way to ask her out on our first date," said Wil with a smile. Wil shared that he was planning to move back to Colorado where he lived right after college, but meeting Kristi changed his mind. Now, they both love calling Kosciusko County their home.

"We love the area for the community, strong faith, and all the work that is going into making Warsaw a better place to live," Kristi said. "Community gatherings like Third Fridays, concerts in the parks, the multiple weekend markets, and all of the various sporting activities available demonstrate that our citizens love to spend time together. Further, we have so many churches and nonprofit organizations where people can serve others in our community through their volunteering or financial giving!"

The Borens both work demanding jobs and are parents to four children ages 26, 20, 19, and 14. Wil is amazed how Kristi always prioritizes the needs of their family first. "I travel fifty percent of the time for my job and Kristi is the one who has always managed the crazy schedules," Wil said. The Borens, however, make it their number one priority to spend time together as a family despite their hectic schedules noting that attending church, playing sports, enjoying the lake, and cooking together are family favorites.

Wil and Kristi said that serving others and being involved in the community are values and actions that were passed on to them by their parents, and it's a legacy they want to pass on to their own children. They try to live out this value by volunteering with nonprofits such as CASA, Joe's Kids, Cardinal Services, Warsaw Community Church, A.C.T.S., Humanity & Hope, and 2nd Mile Missions.

In addition to serving, the Borens have also found joy in giving. They have established three funds at the Community Foundation including:

Boren Family Fund

A Community Fund that the Community Foundation uses to respond to grant requests from local nonprofits.

Wil and Kristi Boren Charitable Fund

A donor advised fund that allows them to recommend grants to a variety of charitable projects that are important to them.

Reach Higher Scholarship Fund

A fund that is especially meaningful to them. One of the Borens' sons inspired the fund after he worked hard to overcome a learning disability in order to be successful in high school and get into college.

"I realized early on that there really wasn't much support to those with learning disabilities to pursue college," said Kristi. The Borens wanted other students with learning challenges to be able to pursue their educational dreams, and so they embraced their son's legacy and created a scholarship fund to do just that.





When Gidieon Cook tragically passed away on June 10, 2019 at only 8 years old, the outpouring of love and support from the Kosciusko County community felt like an embrace to his mother, Keri Fox.

"He was the perfect son anyone could ask for," said Keri. "Gidieon was sweet, funny, compassionate, and caring. He truly was the sweetest little boy. He was light spirited, easy-going, loved going on adventures, playing with insects, riding his dirt bike, and building with Legos. He was such a fun boy to be around."

It was the community's overwhelming support that inspired her to find a way to give back. By creating the **Gidieon Orion Cook Memorial Fund** at the Community Foundation, Keri provided an avenue for the community to come together and make an even bigger impact.

"This fund not only helps me know people still think about my son, it continues to help me heal," Keri said.

"Gidieon loved people and loved supporting people. He would smile so big knowing this fund was created in his name to continue loving people in our community. I just want to make him proud."

The Gidieon Orion Cook Memorial Fund is a Community Fund. Community Funds are used by our Board to meet diverse and changing needs in Kosciusko County in the areas of education, health, recreation, arts and culture, civic projects, the environment, and human services. A grant from the Gidieon Orion Cook Memorial Fund to Harrison Elementary for their Shamrock Shop to help students in need is featured on page 3.

"During a class project around St. Patrick's Day, my son, Cooper, wrote on his shamrock that his wish for a friend was that his family would be able to buy the things they needed," said Ashlie Williams. Cooper was unsettled that some of his friends in his class lacked basic necessities like shoes that fit and clean clothes.

Ashlie spoke with Cooper's teacher and principal at Harrison Elementary School and discovered there were ongoing needs for toiletries, clothes, and shoes. Although the teachers were supporting their students as best they could, the need was too great for them to fully meet.

An extra conference room at Harrison Elementary School was soon transformed into the Shamrock Shop. The shop has been embracing families for nearly three years and includes toiletries, clothing, shoes, winter coats, stuffed animals, and more. The shop is teacher-driven and they can take their students to the shop when they notice a need. The Shamrock Shop relies on community donations and grants to keep the store

stocked with the basic necessities students may need throughout the year.

Recently, the Shamrock Shop received a Community Fund grant from the Gidieon Orion Cook Memorial Fund held at the Community Foundation. Gidieon was a student at Harrison Elementary and tragically passed away in 2019 at the age of 8 years old. "The outpouring of love and support from this community inspired me to find a way to give back," said Keri Fox, Gidieon's mother. "To know this shop is serving so many Harrison families would make Gidieon proud," she added.

Over the last school year, the shop has provided Harrison students with 286 items of clothing, 195 pairs of socks and underwear, 47 winter items like coats and gloves, 50 pairs of shoes, and 280 toiletries.

Community Fund grants are awarded based on a competitive grant application process. Nonprofit organizations serving Kosciusko County can apply in seven areas of interest: education, health, recreation, arts and culture, civic projects, the environment, and human services.

Stillwater Hospice strives to provide compassion, comfort, and guidance through life's journey. They have a comprehensive team that helps terminally ill patients and their families live as fully as possible in their final stages of life. Stillwater proved to be exactly what the Schmitt family needed after an unexpected diagnosis.

"My mom, Kristy, called me one afternoon and mentioned she thought she was having gallbladder pain. Shortly after, we learned that she had incurable pancreatic cancer," said Jennifer Byall, Kristy Schmitt's daughter.

After one round of chemotherapy and radiation, Kristy decided that she did not want to continue treatment. "It was important for us to find the best possible care to keep her comfortable and honor what she needed most," Jennifer said. The Schmitt family learned about the services Stillwater Hospice provides including patient and family education that helped them tremendously during difficult moments.

"We didn't know that Stillwater could handle everything for us during a time when we were feeling the most overwhelmed. They took the stress off of our family and handled everything from medications, to appointments, to honoring my parents privacy during the final stages of my mom's life," Jennifer said.

"As my mom was approaching the last few hours of her life, Jackie, our nurse case manager, came to our house not as our case manager, but as our friend. We will never forget how she made us feel. The team of dedicated individuals gave my mom, and us, the best possible moments together in this tough situation. It is our hope that if others find themselves in a similar situation, they will connect with Stillwater Hospice to experience this amazing organization the same way we did," said Jennifer.

A dream came true for Tippecanoe Valley School Corporation when they received the funding to launch Valley Early Learning Academy for the children of their staff. "Our goal was to provide high-quality child care, not just babysitting," said Meagan Wilks, Director of Special Services at Tippecanoe Valley School. "We also wanted to attract and recruit new staff members more effectively," she added.

When the idea first took shape, the school conducted a survey to gauge the need for such a program within the community. "The responses were overwhelming," Meagan noted. They discovered that while some child care facilities existed in the area, many were at full capacity, and families were traveling long distances between their child care provider and work. Adding a child care facility would help to bridge the gaps for child care where it was needed most in rural settings, like Mentone, Indiana.

The Valley Early Learning Academy is housed in Mentone Elementary School and cares for infants, ages 6 weeks to 16 months, and toddlers from 17 months to 3 years old. Research from the Global Business Coalition For

Education shows that many working parents leave their jobs after having their second child due to the cost and availability of quality child care. "Our mission was to bridge this gap by providing quality child care for our employees who truly needed it," said Meagan. "And with our comprehensive education program, we find the children and families are better prepared for the transition to kindergarten."

"Before this program, finding nearby child care was a challenge," shared Katelyn Bradley, a TVHS staff member with children enrolled in the program. "We were constantly juggling between our parents and friends, which was stressful. Having a reliable and safe place for our boys has been a huge relief."

Tippecanoe Valley School Corporation was a recipient of the Working Together Fund Grant that was made possible through the seventh phase of Lilly Endowment Inc.'s Giving Indiana Funds for Tomorrow (GIFT VII) initiative to increase access to child care and housing, provide job training for people with disabilities, and for talent attraction and retention efforts.




